

### **PUBLIC WIF**

Once the user hits "Accept & Continue" to agree to our Computer Use Policy, they will be able to freely use the WiFi.

NPL is excited to share a few recent updates from our Circulation and Library Card Policy & Meeting Room Policy.

#### Circulation & Library Card Policy | updated 11/22/24

- Customers with a PLAC card or a Reciprocal card may access new DVDs and equipment.
- Student cards have the same privileges as Child & Teen cards.
- Child and Teens may borrow up to 13 DVDs (3 new, 10 old).
   Child and Teen cards may only check out DVDs and video games from the Kids and Teen collections.
- All items, including new DVDs and hotspots will be on hold for 3 days.
- Linked Cards: Cardholders may "link" household members under the age of 18 to an adult cardholder (the "primary" cardholder) who will be responsible for all fees, fines and payment for lost or damaged materials charged on the linked card. In the case of two adults with linked cards, the primary cardholder is not liable for any fees, fines and payments accrued by the linked adult card. Linked cardholders are able to pick up holds for anyone linked to them.

#### Meeting Room Policy | updated 11/22/24

- For-profits or private individuals are no longer limited to 4 reservations per year.
- There is no charge to use the kitchen.
- Rooms may be scheduled up to 1 year in advance.


### **How to Participate:**






#### The Nappanee Center Quilt Garden Committee is accepting new members to help plant and care for the 2025 guilt garden!
