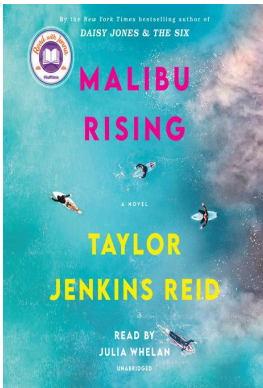

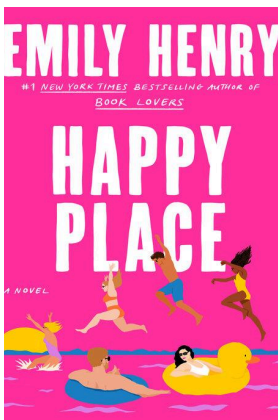
Beach:

Malibu Rising by Taylor Jenkins Reid, F Reid, BOCD F Reid, Libby e-book & e-audio



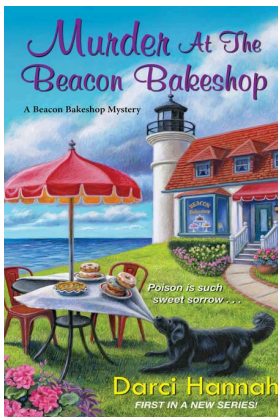

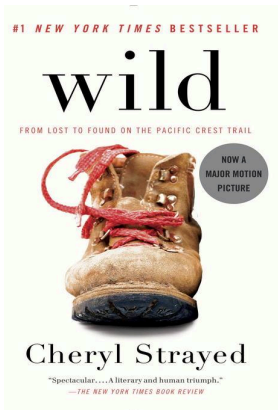
Murder at the Beacon Bakeshop by Darci Hannah, M Hann Beacon Bk. 1, Libby and Hoopla e-book & e-audio

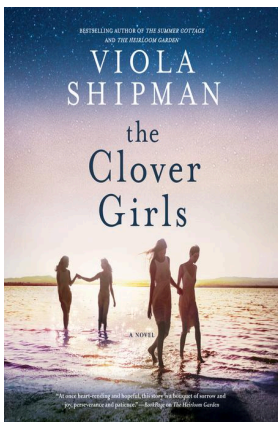
Camping:

Wild: From Lost to Found on the Pacific Crest Trail by Cheryl Strayed, Bio Strayed Cheryl, Libby e-book & e-audio



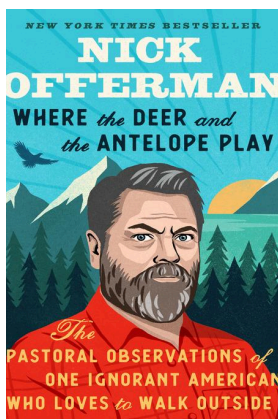

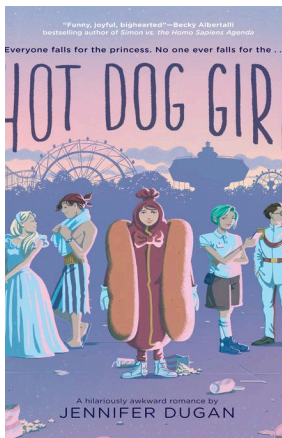
Where the Deer and the Antelope Play by Nick Offerman, TRAVEL PARKS Offerman, Libby e-book & e-audio

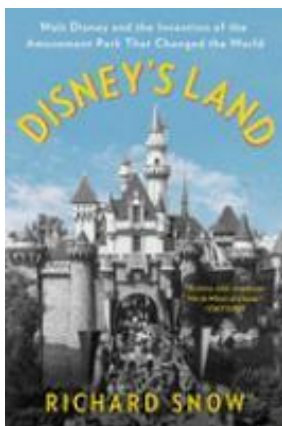
Theme Park:

Hot Dog Girl by Jennifer Dugan, T Duga, Libby e-book & e-audio



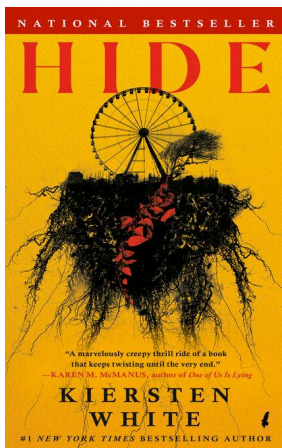
